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HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS

Imagination and wonderful, wacky ideas are everywhere this week as ghosts, goblins, astronauts, ballerinas and cartoon characters celebrate Halloween. Unfortunately, some of the best parts of Halloween, from carving the pumpkin to traipsing around in the dark, are also the most dangerous. Keep your children safe this year. Here are some of the dangers and ways to avoid them:

- Paint that face! It's safer than a mask, and more fun too.
- Make costumes short. Don't hike up long skirts, cut them off for safety.
- Secure hats so they will not slip over children's eyes.
- Wear shoes that fit. Children should never wear mom's high heels or dad's boots.
- Stay on the sidewalk. Don't cut through yards.
- Decorate costumes, bags and sacks with reflective tape or paints.
- Use Halloween costumes that are light or bright enough to be seen at night.
- Never let kids under age eight go trick-or-treating without an adult.
- Remind children to stop, look left, right, and then left again before crossing any street.
- Look for "Flame Resistant" labels on costumes, masks, beards and wigs.
- Use fire resistant material for all homemade costumes.
- Avoid costumes made out of flimsy material and outfits with big baggy sleeves or billowing skirts.
- Only give and accept wrapped or packaged candy.
- Go trick-or-treating in the daylight.

Teachers must be available for both the training day and review day, noted below, for their subject area.

Leave time would need to be provided by the district. MDE will pay for mileage, lodging, and lunch. We will be reviewing programs from Adrian, Albion, Madonna, Marygrove, MSU, SVSU, and UM-Dearborn.

Reviewers needed:

Elementary/middle mathematics teacher (we already have two representatives from Lansing Public Schools)
Elementary/middle social studies teacher (current reps are from Farmington, Roscommon, Holly, and Midland)
Elementary/middle French teacher (current reps are from Livonia and Traverse City)

District or ISD mathematics coordinator Secondary history teacher (current rep is from Holly) Secondary sociology teacher (current rep is from Midland)

Training for math, social studies, history and sociology reviewers will be Nov 8 (full day).

Training for French reviewers will be December 4 (full day). The mathematics PR/PE conference will be held on January 7-8, 2002.

The social studies PR/PE conference (includes history and sociology) will be held on January 29-30.

The French PR/PE conference (optional for majority of reviewers) will be held on January 28.


